This is in further response to your October 7, 2019, Freedom of Information Act request seeking access to records pertaining to the salary, job description, and length of tenure of former attorney Gabriel Aaron Davis, as well as a copy of his resume, excluding his home address, telephone, and email address.

After review of the responsive Civil Rights Division documents, I have determined that the enclosed document may be released to you subject to the deletion of personal information pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(6) since disclosure thereof would constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. In addition, Mr. Davis was an attorney with the Department of Justice, Civil Rights Division, Criminal Section from January 11, 2015 to June 25, 2018. He was a GS-15 attorney earning \$143,774 per year when he left the Division in 2018.

If you are not satisfied with my response to this request, you may administratively appeal by writing to the Director, Office of Information Policy (OIP), United States Department of Justice, 441 G Street, NW, 6th Floor, Washington, DC 20530-0001, or you may submit an appeal through OIP's FOIAonline portal by creating an account on the following web site: <https://foiaonline.regulations.gov/foia/action/public/home>. Your appeal must be postmarked or electronically transmitted within 90 days of the date of my response to your request. If you submit your appeal by mail, both the letter and the envelope should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Act Appeal."

I hope the Civil Rights Division has been of some assistance to you in this matter.
